PeaceMaker Minnesota Fund For Schools In The Mounds View School District

December 31, 2020 Report

Purpose: To be a permanent resource for helping PeaceMaker Minnesota partner schools in the Mounds View School District to be safer places, free from bullying and harassment, and to help students learn positive relational skills like empathy, respect, cooperation and how to resolve conflicts peacefully.

Total Amount Contributed Since The Fund's Creation: \$34,764 December 31, 2020 Fair Market Value Of The Fund: \$51,821.36

Investment Return: Contributions are invested in a balanced index fund that returned 16.4% during 2020 and averaged a 9.82% annual return over the past 10 years. The expense ratio .07% and PeaceMaker does not charge a management fee.

Total Endowment Payouts Since Its Creation: \$0 2021 Scheduled Endowment Payout: \$1,800

Notes Relative To The Fund: PeaceMaker Minnesota had active partnerships with Sunnyside Elementary, Highview Middle School and Oak Grove School / Reach Academy from 2008 to 2016. During that time PeaceMaker Minnesota provided the schools with \$104,070 in financial assistance. PeaceMaker Minnesota has a partnership with the district's Career Life and Transition program, but funding separate from this fund has been used to support their work. Efforts will be made to partner with a school in the district. If a partnership is not established this year's payout will be reinvested into the fund.

PeaceMaker Minnesota Summary: PeaceMaker Minnesota supports a network of 37 partner schools (public, private and charter / K-12 schools & transition programs serving students with disabilities) committed to violence prevention education. Started in 1998 with just over \$8,181 in contributions, PeaceMaker Minnesota has provided more than \$1,225,000 in financial assistance to schools and has developed seven endowment funds with a combined value of about \$600,000.



MISSION

To help create a more peaceful world, our mission is to help schools to be safer places, free from bullying and harassment, and to help youth learn positive relational skills like empathy, respect, cooperation and how to resolve conflicts peacefully.

WHAT WE PROVIDE



Financial Services reimburse schools for training, curriculum, and supplies to build community and strengthen violence prevention efforts. Partner schools can receive \$500 and access additional matching money to support teachers and other staff in teaching kids to be peacemakers.



Ambassadors for Respect Program (A4R) brings individuals with developmental disabilities into schools to teach 4th graders about inclusion, Person First Language, and advocacy.



Peace Guide Services support school staff members and students in building community by providing a part-time Peace Guide to resolve conflicts, repair harm, and improve relationships.



Training Services help teachers, administrators, bus drivers, and others to recognize, respond to, and prevent bullying. Trainings can also help students become peer mediators.



Giving Schools Tools to Stop Violence



We serve public and private schools across

Minnesota. Over 40 schools have joined our Partner School Network.

To date, we've provided more than \$1.2 million in financial assistance to schools.

In 2020, we helped 27
Minnesota schools in
their efforts to provide a safe, positive learning environment.

We served over 12,000 students in 2020.

This year, 11 schools have joined our network, and 13 have asked for financial assistance. We expect requests to increase in the fall.



We engage and support school employees, students, and others in helping kids build community and develop healthy relational skills.
